

The Valley Jazz Cooperative Scholarship Program

for high school seniors

ABOUT THE PROGRAM:

The Valley Jazz Cooperative Scholarship Program is designed to recognize outstanding high school seniors, in support of their post-secondary education. Scholarships are awarded annually to three current or former VJC ensemble participants. Scholarship recipients are talented young musicians, with emphasis given to individuals who have made meaningful contributions to their communities through service to others. As a long-term goal, the VJCSP encourages its scholarship recipients to continue making positive impacts on society through community engagement and service, as well as support for/participation in the arts.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION:

- Each scholarship recipient will be presented with an award of \$500.00, annually renewable over a four-year period, for a maximum possible total award of \$2,000.00. [See requirements for **Maintaining Annual Eligibility**, below.]
- The funds will be made available by September 1st, each year and paid directly to the Office of the Bursar (or equivalent) at the accredited 2- or 4-year educational institution in which the scholarship recipient is enrolled as a full-time student.
- Some educational institutions charge a *third-party billing fee* upon receipt of sponsorship or financial aid from external sources, including a VJCSP award. Any such fees applied to one's account by their educational institution are solely the responsibility of the scholarship recipient.
- The Valley Jazz Cooperative Scholarship Program is generously supported by MSW Ministries. (Visit MSWMinistries.org to learn more about the VJC's parent organization.)

MINIMUM REQUIRED CRITERIA FOR APPLICANTS:

- The applicant must be a high school senior.
- The applicant must intend to begin a post-secondary education as a full-time student at a 2- or 4-year college or university in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

MINIMUM REQUIRED CRITERIA FOR APPLICANTS (continued):

- The applicant must have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 through mid-term grades of senior year (or equivalent GPA for institutions not employing a four-point grading system).
- The applicant must have previously participated in the Valley Jazz Cooperative as a positive, contributing member of a VIC ensemble.

ADDITIONAL PREFERRED CRITERIA FOR APPLICANTS:

- The applicant has shown selfless, servant leadership in outreach activities, demonstrating a commitment to others through participation in events sponsored by one's church, school, or community (or initiated independently in whole or in part by the applicant).
- The applicant intends to major or minor in an undergraduate program (at an accredited 2-or 4-year college or university) in one of the following areas:
 - 1) music,
 - 2) other performing or visual arts,
 - 3) education,
 - 4) social work/human services,
 - 5) theology, or
 - 6) some other area of study that credibly charts a path toward making positive contributions to one's community (post-graduation) through direct service to others or alternative means.
- The applicant is currently participating in the Valley Jazz Cooperative as a positive, contributing member of a VIC ensemble.

APPLICATION PROCESS/REQUIREMENTS:

- The applicant must submit the following two *required* items:
 - 1) A completed Valley Jazz Cooperative Scholarship Program application form.
 - 2) A copy of the applicant's high school transcript, current through senior year midterm grades, providing one's cumulative high school GPA.
- The completed application may also include the following *optional* item:
 - 1) A supporting letter of recommendation from a pastor/worship leader, teacher, project supervisor, or mentor, addressing the applicant's candidacy for this scholarship and (if applicable) providing details of the applicant's involvement in one or more service/outreach activities.

 [Note: If this optional item is submitted as part of the application, it should be sent directly to the VJC/MSW by the recommender, allowing the letter to remain confidential. As a courtesy to the recommender, it is requested that the applicant

provide them with a stamped envelope, in which the recommendation may be

- Competed applications may be submitted on or after February 1st, each year.
- Completed applications must be received by April 1st, each year.

APPLICATION PROCESS/REQUIREMENTS (continued):

PROCESS FOR AWARDING SCHOLARSHIPS:

- The Director of the Valley Jazz Cooperative shall not be involved in the evaluation process beyond assessing the eligibility of each applicant to be considered for an award by confirming required and preferred application criteria for the adjudication panel.
- An adjudication panel of MSW Ministries staff shall be convened each year to evaluate all eligible applications. The adjudication panel shall rank these by merit, awarding VJC Scholarships to the individuals submitting the two most outstanding applications. The third VJC Scholarship shall be awarded as deemed necessary to fulfill desired diversity criteria (set forth below).
- The adjudication panel will work to ensure a more diverse scholarship recipient list. Toward that effort, unless it is impossible to do so with the pool of qualified, eligible applicants, scholarships awarded each year shall be made to at least:
 - 1) one female student, and
 - 2) one male student.
- If the first two VJC Scholarships are awarded to one female student and one male student, then the third-most outstanding applicant shall be awarded the remaining VJC Scholarship. If the first two VJC Scholarships awarded do not meet both categories, then the third and final VJC Scholarship shall be awarded to the most outstanding applicant whose selection would allow both categories to receive coverage (if possible, given the pool of qualified, eligible applicants).
- During any application cycle in which fewer than three eligible/completed applications are received by the stated deadline, the VJCSP adjudication panel reserves the right to award scholarships (that would otherwise go unawarded) to the most outstanding applicants from previous years. Specifically, such consideration is only given to exceptional individuals who applied but did not receive VJC scholarships as high school seniors.
- The announcement of scholarship award winners will occur no earlier than May 1st and no later than June 1st, each year. A list of previous scholarship award winners may be kept and posted on the ValleyJazz.org web site.

MAINTAINING ANNUAL ELIGIBILITY:

• Scholarship recipients must maintain full-time student status (minimum of 24 credit hours completed each academic year) at an accredited 2- or 4-year college or university.


MAINTAINING ANNUAL ELIGIBILITY (continued):

- Scholarship recipients must maintain the following cumulative post-secondary GPAs as measured at the end of the spring semester in order to continue to receive the award for the following academic year:
 - 1) a GPA of 2.75 at the conclusion of one's freshman year,
 - 2) a GPA of 2.875 at the conclusion of one's sophomore year, and
 - 3) a GPA of 3.0 at the conclusion of one's junior year.
- In order to facilitate continued support from this program, VJC Scholarship recipients must submit a copy of their most recent academic transcript (complete through the preceding spring term) to the VJC/MSW by August 1st, each year.
- Scholarship recipients who terminate their post-secondary studies mid-academic year will be required to refund 50% of their annual award (\$250.00) to MSW Ministries.
- Scholarship recipients must not publicly act in a manner that would damage, tarnish, or otherwise negatively impact the reputation and goodwill associated with the Valley Jazz Cooperative and MSW Ministries.
- Future scholarships will not be awarded to a recipient who fails to meet any of the eligibility standards articulated on the preceding pages.

APPLICATION FORM:

- The following two pages in this packet constitute the official Application Form for the Valley Jazz Cooperative Scholarship Program. Please complete and submit the form as directed.
- The final two pages are an *optional* item: a Valley Jazz Cooperative Scholarship Program Letter of Recommendation form. Should the applicant ask a pastor/worship leader, teacher, project supervisor, or mentor to write in support of their VJCSP submission, the recommender can either use this form or provide their own letter. The recommender is encouraged to provide details regarding any involvement by the applicant in service/outreach activities, if applicable.
